

# NET REFERENCE - LOOP TOOL



**WARNING: Your net pool cover does not replace adult supervision.**

**It is designed to act as a last line of defense. Children should never be left unattended.**

## HELPFUL TIPS AND MAINTENANCE

1. Store your net in a location where : rodents or animals will not nest or damage the net: away from heat sources, pool heater, water heater, fire pit, BBQ, etc.
2. Each net is custom made because every pool/spa is shaped differently. Therefore, the tension on the net may vary at different areas due to the shape of the pool. Install clips located on turns first, then straight runs. The net must be replaced in exactly the same position each time. An anchor will be specially painted and clip marked with a different color twine to indicate the reference point so that you are sure to get the net aligned properly.
3. The net may have two or more style anchors. The anchor pictured to the right is the most common, Conehead Clip with Keyhole Anchor. These anchors need to be fastened first when applying the net. The Round Loop Clips with threaded anchors should be fastened last for they allow you to apply the tension to the net with the use of the tool as demonstrated in the bottom left picture. Reverse order for removal. When the net is not in use, be sure to set threaded anchors flush with T-Handle Allen Tool to prevent obstruction.
4. Net material is designed to contract, therefore the net will shrink as it sits off the pool, the longer it's off, the more difficult it may be to apply the net. If the net is off the pool for more than a week, it may need to be adjusted by a service tech for a nominal fee.
5. Clips may be able to be removed by a strong adult or older child without the use of the tool. The key is that a toddler or young child cannot remove the clips and that a supervising adult prevents the child from playing with the clips or on the net.
6. Jumping or playing on the net will cause premature damage to the net (fraying or broken strands). The net is an emergency safety device, premature wear from improper use can make the net fail when needed for an safety emergency.
